




Population Pyramid








Estimated Total Population






% of Estimated Population by Age



Estimated Total Labour Force


In 2019, the ratio of employed persons to unemployed persons age 65 and over, is estimated to be 3.9-to-1 (oldage support ratio); and in 2039 the ratio is forecast to decline to approx. 1.7-to-1


Lifetime Healthcare Costs

The most significant increase in population occurs across the age band that contributes to the greatest cost









Change in Expenditure over 20 Years

Delivery of Services

- Is there sufficient capacity within the healthcare system to deliver the care?
 - Increased number of elderly and the elderly are living longer
 - Human Capital
 - Greater utilization from the elderly
 - How will the system cope with increased demand?
 - Will there be enough practitioners to meet the demand?
 - Infrastructure
 - Prevalence of need for assisted living care in a non-residence based setting rises significantly from age 75
 - Needs range from retirement residences, skilled nursing long-term care facilities, hospital based facilities, palliative care facilities
 - Major infrastructure requires long-term planning



Financing and Sustainability

- Recognize the problem!
- Budgeting for one year ahead is insufficient
 - Financing is a component of a risk management program
- Should healthcare financing be pre-funded?
 - Alternative sources of funding?
 - Could the pension system adapt?
- Plan reviews
 - What's covered, how are costs shared
 - How are services reimbursed
 - Alternate methods of delivery
 - Can the system deliver care in the appropriate setting and at an affordable cost
 - Use of new technologies
- Immigration?
